"Fear Not!"

How Emergency Pedagogy can deter fear and anxiety in children and young people in times of crisis

Dear ladies and gentlemen, dear friends, I would like to warmly invite you to this year's annual Emergency Pedagogy Conference.

The conference will take place on 31st May to 02nd June 2024 at the Parzival Center in Karlsruhe under the title:

"Fear not! – How Emergency Pedagogy can deter fear and anxiety in children and young people in times of crisis"

The current world situation is characterized by crises, wars and catastrophes. The increase in disasters and their media coverage inevitably leads to an increase in fears, feelings of threat and traumatization.

Children and young people are among the most vulnerable population groups.

The physical, emotional and mental health of our children and young people is under strain.

Many studies show a worrying increase in concentration problems, sleep disorders, exhaustion, depression, addictive behavior and suicidal tendencies. The increase in anxiety disorders is particularly dramatic. They can be seen as an accompanying phenomenon of collective traumatization with a tendency to burnout.

The educational scientist Klaus Hurrelmann therefore sees "signs of a collective post-traumatic stress disorder" in view of the overall social situation.

Fear, initially, should not be judged negatively. It draws attention to impending dangers and activates appropriate coping strategies to avert

danger. However, if fear becomes constant stress, brain functions are restructured and the human immune system is permanently damaged. Fear then makes you sick!

The topics of fear and trauma are closely linked. There is no trauma without fear. It is one of the core symptoms of traumatization. Unprocessed, long-term traumatic stress has destructive potential, which, if the outcome is unfavorable, can lead to a break in one's biography.

However, not everyone affected, breaks down because of traumatic experiences. They have resilience factors that enable them to process and biographically integrate their experiences. Why trauma-related disorders ultimately arise from trauma, depends not only on the traumatic event, but above all on various individual factors and environmental influences. The latter can be influenced pedagogically and therapeutically.

What effect does fear have on the people? What is the connection between fear and trauma? How can emergency pedagogy be a process for reducing anxiety in the specific phases of child development?

These pressing topics and tasks will be addressed in lectures and workshops at the emergency pedagogical annual conference, to which I would like to cordially invite you.

I am really looking forward to our meeting and our exchange at the Parzival Center Karlsruhe.
